The Fabric of the Church Building

The Quinquennial report on our fabric was received in early spring. There were no critical issues raised. Both the lightening conductor and the bells were inspected during the year and are in a satisfactory state.

Repairs during the year included a number of small broken and cracked window panes, slipped slates, a broken gutter, pointing of some external stonework and worn panels to two doors.

The new electronic organ was augmented with a recording and remote playing device, allowing us to have music even when we have no organist at a service. Mirrors have been installed to allow the organist to see down the aisle.

Thanks to our cleaners, security staff (Di and Molly), clock winder (Dan), mowers (Shaun and Andrew) and all who do numerous tasks, week in and week out. Thank you also to those of you who helped with the St Leonard's Day tidying. Many hands do make for lighter work.

THE PCC MET SEVEN TIMES in the year 2017.

Ten members were elected at the annual meeting; four members sit ex-officio (with ONE vacancy - The second Deanery Synod representative) making thirteen members in total.

Our new organ now has the added facility of a recordable sound card meaning that we can have music at services when an organist is unavailable. The system is easy to use and is a growing bank of music and hymns is being accumulated on the sound card. A special mention must go to James Robinson for his additional work with the new organ and sound box. Also a big 'thank you' to our talented pool of organists who provide us with 'live' music whenever possible. In the year we lost the services of Mr John Hampshire who moved away. The thanks of the congregation were conveyed to John at his last service in August, 2017.
