From The Revd Andy Froud

Dear Friends,



THEY'VE had the Christmas stuff out since SEPTEMBER! Given that this must be one of the most common complaints I hear, it might seem a bit of a push to celebrate the 12 days of Christmas. It's easy to forget that the Twelve Days of Christmas is not just a seasonal song but that Christmas is really 12 days. Because the shops get their junk out earlier and earlier every year quite a lot of people are ready to breathe a sigh of relief and call Christmas a day by Boxing Day.

Complaints about the commercialism of Christmas are nothing new. During the late Middle Ages the Twelve Days of Christmas were notoriously times of drunkenness, carousing and conspicuous consumption during the middle of the winter. Ironically this and its association with Catholicism led to Christmas being briefly "banned" by the Puritans during the seventeenth century.

I hope you have a happy, peaceful and blessed Christmas: this is my Christmas list, not of presents but of things that think will make for a better Christmas for all over the 12 Days of Christmas: Make some time every day to be quiet; light a candle and say a prayer if you can. Mary and Joseph will be doing the rounds with Posada and can help you with this during Advent as we prepare for Christmas and during the 12 days as we look forward to Epiphany use the booklet Follow the Star! Give to charity: we all fall into the trap of giving people things they don't want or don't need. Plenty of charities accept donations instead of a gift. Reflect on the most precious gift that we have - our time. How do we use it? Do we waste it self-ishly or use it bring joy to others?

And one final thought: one of my mother's sayings (which she in turn got from her Sunday School days) "every day is Christmas, every day is Easter". Each day may we celebrate the birth, death and resurrection of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ,



History Group

ON Monday 4th November Brian Jeffery outlined the fluctuating fortunes of Sabden in his talk called 'Heyhouses' and the Calico Printers, 1790-1930.

Starting out as a Royal Chase in 1086, the area was under populated and given over to just eleven vaccaries (cow farms). These passed through the ownership of a succession of local families until the 18th century. Industrialists from Accrington called Bury, Fort and Taylor saw an opportunity in Sabden's ready supply of clean water to develop this 'Hidden Valley' into a major manufacturing centre for calico printing. Overseeing the development of new methods of treating and dying, they produced high quality prints which were exported all over the world. Unfortunately, due to a misunderstanding over Churn Clough reservoir in 1885 and a subsequent dispute over access to water, there was a court case which resulted in an unfavourable decision and the printworks were closed, leaving 2,000 people jobless. The new Sabden Cooperative Printing Company was set up in 1904 as a joint venture between the owners and 110 villagers, but the printworks burnt down in 1912. Today little physical evidence remains of the previous industrial activity on the site, but the history of both the calico printworks and the later cotton mills have been photographically documented in the book 'Sabden Past and Present' by Audrey Barrett and David Eaves.

The next meeting of the group will take place on Tuesday 7th January, at the Village Hall, at 7.30 pm. when Shirley Penman makes a return visit when she will give a presentation on the Clitheroe Mayoral regalia. JP
